The Black Forest Arts & Crafts Guild Scholarship was created in 2006 and is awarded annually to a graduating senior(s) attending a high school (public, private, charter, or home school). Applicants must physically reside within the boundaries as defined later within this application.

Eligible students must have been accepted, or intend to enroll in an accredited college, university, trade school, or other institution of higher education by the fall of 2024.

The Black Forest Arts & Crafts Guild was established in 1964 and is the longest, continuously running Craft Guild West of the Mississippi River. It consists of local artists and crafters who annually donate to groups, and individuals that enhance the Black Forest community. Members of the Guild, the local community, and patrons of our Spring and Fall Craft Shows fund the scholarship.

All qualified applications will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee which is comprised of members of the Guild.

Miscellaneous:

- The winner will be notified by telephone or by announcement at their school's Senior Awards Assembly.
- The committee will work with the winner to ensure the check is delivered to the Registrar of their school of choice.

Boundaries and Amount of Award:

Applicants must reside within the following boundaries to be eligible for consideration: Starting at the corner of Colorado 83 and Shoup Road, the boundary line shall continue east on Shoup Road to Howells Road, then south on Howells Road to Old Ranch Road, then east on Old Ranch Road to Old Ranch Road easement, continuing east on Old Ranch Road to Black Forest Road, South on Black Forest Road to Briargate Boulevard/Stapleton Road, east on Briargate Boulevard/Stapleton Road to Eastonville Road, then north on Eastonville Road to Evans Road, then west on Evans Road to Meridian Road, then north on Meridian Road to County Line Road, then west on County Line Road to Colorado 83, then south on Colorado 83 to Shoup Road. The boundary lines shall run down the middle of all lines or roads.

The Black Forest Arts & Crafts Guild is committed to providing at least one scholarship of \$1,000. Additional monies may be added to the award by patrons of our fall and spring craft shows and the local community; therefore, the total amount of the award above \$1,000 is not known at this time.

Applicants are judged solely on their merits and accomplishments. Once notified; **the winner has until September 1, 2024 to claim the award.** If it goes unclaimed; it will be **forfeited** and applied to the Guild's following year's scholarship fund.
